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# Oregon Carbon Dioxide Standard

First State Law to Regulate Greenhouse Gases

- Regulates CO<sub>2</sub>: New power plants must offset part of their CO<sub>2</sub> emissions in order to get a site permit
- <u>Unique Non-Profit Role</u>: Power plants can pay money to a non-profit trust to comply with the Standard

• Trust Buys Offsets: The Climate Trust buys offsets from projects that reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions



### What is an Offset?

An Environmental Commodity that is Bought and Sold

#### • Results of a project, not the project itself

#### • Key requirements:

- Reduces atmospheric CO<sub>2</sub> levels below what they would have been without a project
- "Additional:" Project must need offset funding to proceed
- Quantified: Monitoring and verification required



# **Truck Stop Idle Reduction**

A High Environmental Priority

- West Coast governors: Near term CO<sub>2</sub> action item
- Governor Kulongoski: Oregon Solutions Project
- West Coast Diesel Emissions Reduction Collaborative
- Oregon DEQ Clean Diesel Initiative priority



# **Truck Stop Idle Reduction**

#### An Attractive CO<sub>2</sub> Offset

- Additional: Emerging technology needs capital to proceed
- Quantifiable: Straightforward to monitor and verify
- Ownership: "Chain of custody" can be addressed in contracts
- **Co-Benefits**:
  - Reduced air pollution
  - Saves energy
  - Truck stops more attractive



# The Climate Trust's Initiative

\$2 Million Committed to Truck Stop Idle Reduction

- Leverages other funds (~\$6 million total)
  - USEPA grant (applied for): OSU is partner
  - ODOE's BETC tax credit
  - Equity invested by technology providers
- Projects must meet our offset criteria
  - Additional, monitoring & verification, ownership chain
  - Price: \$4/metric ton
    - Equals several thousand dollars per parking space treated
  - Enough funds for around 600 parking spaces



## **Idle Reduction Offset Initiative**

Initial Thoughts for Process for Putting Projects in Place

#### Request for proposals

- Technology provider and truck stop(s) submit proposals
- Review by The Climate Trust and OSU project team
- Scheduled release is in October/November

#### Decision making

- The Climate Trust makes independent decisions
  - Project team works with Offset Committee on Board recommendation
  - Board makes final funding decisions
- ODOE makes its own independent decisions
- But we will coordinate as partners in this project

Initial Thoughts for Process for Putting Projects in Place

- Goals: Construction starts middle of next year
  - Solicit projects via RFP
  - Evaluate and select projects
  - Negotiate offset acquisition contracts
  - Fund and construct
