STRATEGIES

- 1) New gardens opening in 2010: Madison, Vestal, Gilbert Heights (60 new gardeners)
- 2) New gardens in development: Frazer, Sumner, Errol Heights
- 3) Dividing plots in half to make 200 sq. foot plots
- 4) One plot per household rule enforced (some people had two gardens)
- 5) Getting garden managers to report abandoned plots more quickly
- 6) Provide information on alternative gardening opportunities (yard share, etc.)
- 7) Raise capital through grants and donations, solicit garden sponsorships
- 8) Increase the operating budget
- 9) Charge fees for classes (already doing this for pruning class)
- 10) Pursue use of Washington Monroe site for short-term garden
