Updates (approximately 5 minutes each)

Community Projects

Bill Haack

Bill handed out an overview of projects in the City of Vernonia. The handout outlines relationships with the school district, city, county and state agencies. At the natural resources curriculum group meeting this morning, Bill discussed a school project to name the wetland slated for September 2012. Bill commented that the city and school district are moving forward with an Oregon Park & Recreation concept grant, visualized as a strategic classroom for the school. The city will continue to work with the school district. Side two of the handout details the projects the city will continue to move forward. Senator Betsy Johnson said this is the first time that all of the catalytic changes that have occurred all along the way are in one document, it shows the most tangible evidence of the phoenix transformation that has occurred in this community.

The Rebuilding Center of Portland has gotten an anonymous grant to salvage some of the materials of the WGS building. Senator Betsy Johnson asked the campaign to explain why the rebuilding center opportunity is unique. The rebuilding center tries to use local workers as much as possible and attempts to use some of the reclaimed timbers, clear old growth beams, etc. Tony Hyde commented that it adds to the whole flavor of sustainability.

Construction

Dr. Ken Cox, Steve Effros

Steve reported that the project is in the last stages of construction and compliance of codes for temporary occupancy BOORA is taking the lead. Beyond June 8 is the date for the major completion. LEED requirements will be done, including flushing the buildings out of the building which will be done before students occupy. August completion and opening ceremonies were discussed. LEED platinum is still being pursued. The ODOT road project is still on track - June will be the start of the road construction work that is planned. There is a two phase process of landscaping. Irrigation is temporary to establish plantings, major planting of trees planned. Second phase is the seven year phase for completion and maintenance of wetlands.

Project Budget**Dr. Ken Cox**

Dr. Cox reported that the first \$2 million from the legislature is on its way. The budget is close to the \$40 million dollar mark. The department of education we are working with them on another bridge financing opportunity. Tony Hyde commented that he has heard some younger people talk about the new school project that was somewhat negative. All the pieces that are not in play are not thought of. There is not a component that has not been thought out. There are always neigh sayers, we need to work harder to get the word out there that all of those components have been considered.

Senator Betsy Johnson commented that the district and its partners have raised, in the worst economy since the great depression, \$40 million dollars and the school will open when promised.

Larry McKinley reported on ODOT updates. There were some dollars that were spent before ODOT became involved, and will be reimbursed to the district.

Resource Budget & Upcoming Fundraising Activities**John Donovan**

John reported that there are several opportunities are still being pursued. We can open the school and bring other opportunities on line as soon as available. The best pitch is now when the school is still under construction. There are more opportunities with national foundations, state agencies, and Vernonia community members that are being pursued. Stories need to be shared and told. There are partners that will help tell the story. Clear Channel radio stations are continuing to support the campaign in the latter part of June and again in Mid-August.

Student Fundraising**Mrs. Willard & Students MaKayla Adams and Summer Snow**

MaKayla and Summer, VHS freshman, presented the results of the student campaign called "Donate a Dollar, Build a Building, Save a Town." \$4,700.33 was raised. The Challenge to the other schools has been met and Tony Hyde and Mike Pihl will be visiting Perrydale school in Yamhill County as the grand prize award.
