A DETACHMENT WAS TRAVELING FROM THE DALLES TO OREGON CITY.

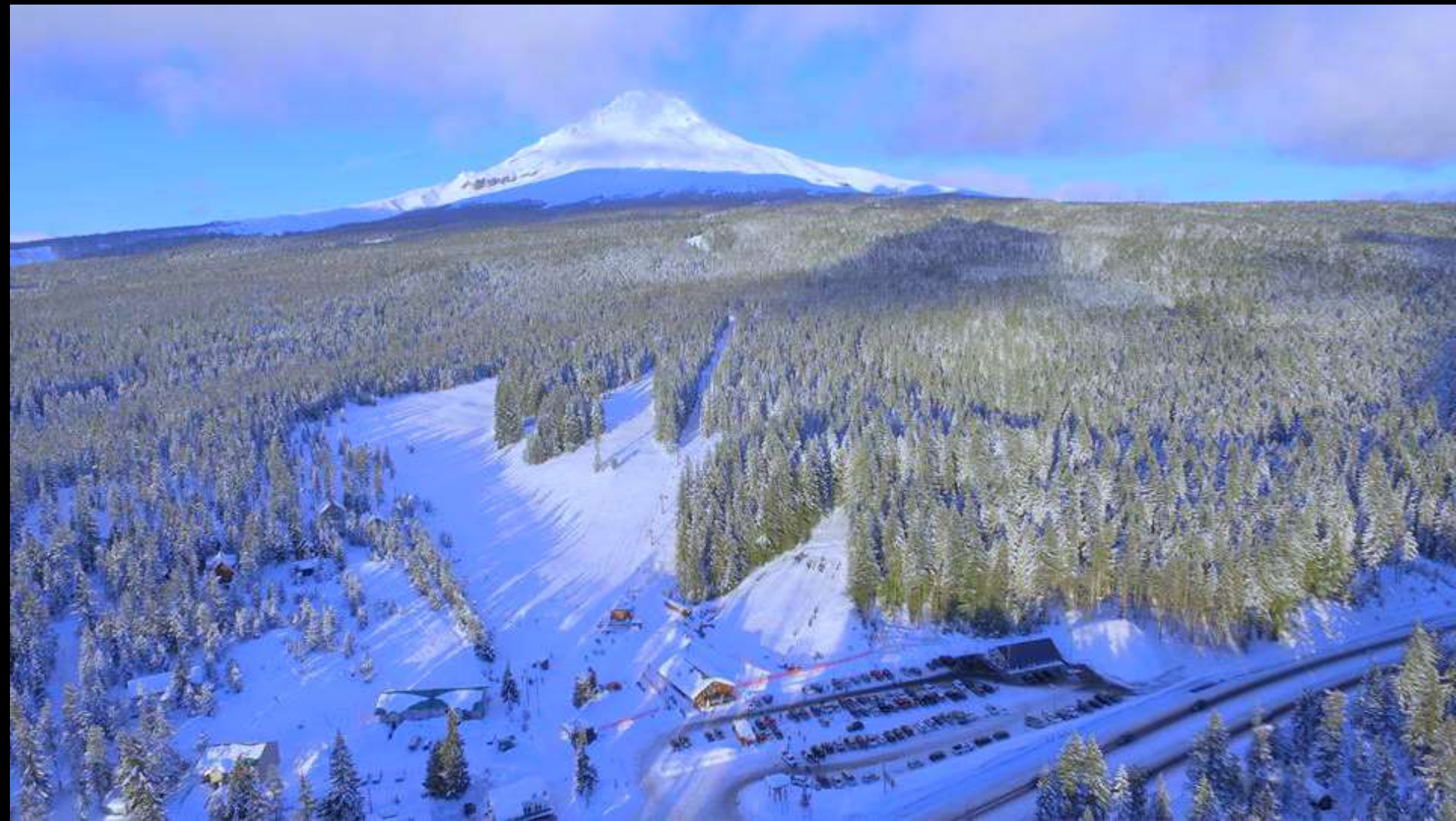
